Dear Parents

This time last week I wrote to you from sunny Malta and I can safely say that the conditions outside this morning are very different indeed. However, there is a brightness and crispness that reminds us that a magical time of the year is only just around the corner. Prep schools are often at their most joyful as we move towards the festive period and I very much look forward to all of the memorable moments that December will bring. We will get a head start on Christmas next week, with the Christmas tree going up in the Green Room from Monday for all of your kind gift donations for the charity Break.

My week began with the final day of the Year 7 Pre Senior Baccalaureate (PSB) Sports and Culture Tour to Malta. With a strong focus on the six core skills that lie at the heart of a PSB education, during the trip our pupils enjoyed a beach sports day; a morning of Padel at the National Padel Centre; a Grand Harbour ferry trip; a Gala Dinner at Haileybury Malta; and an incredible sightseeing day in the capital city, Valletta. The children were a credit to the School, embodying The Town Close Way and approaching every activity with great enthusiasm and energy. They collaborated happily with pupils from the other schools and displayed exemplary teamwork across a range of activities. Free time gave them opportunities to enjoy the two swimming pools in the hotel, play team building games, and socialise with their new friends from [Pennthorpe School](#). Whilst the Halloween-themed Gala Dinner night, brought everyone together for a celebratory evening of fun and dancing! Our sincere thanks to Haileybury Malta for hosting us all and for arranging and co-ordinating a fantastic tour that will live long in the memory.

One of my highlights of this week was the fantastic 4W Class Assembly, which followed on from a brilliant 4A class assembly last week. Our Year 4 pupils have been learning about the Vikings this term, and 4W's understanding truly came to life in a wonderful Class Assembly performed for families and peers. They shared the history of the Vikings with confidence, including a brilliantly choreographed moment in which the children joined together to form the outline of a dragon ship to bring it to life. Their retelling of 'How Thor Got His Hammer' was, also, expertly acted. Some fantastic singing tied the whole assembly together beautifully. Well done, 4W; your hard work really shone through!

In my assembly this morning, I was so pleased to see a huge amount of Commendations and Headmaster's Commendations being awarded for a tremendous range of achievements – I look forward to cake in my Study with those well-deserving pupils who received Headmaster's Commendations (though I will have to think creatively about how to fit you all on the sofas!)

As part of our project with The Royal Society, our Eco Council carried out an audit of the nest boxes on site, working together to mark their location on a site map and noting the type of nest box and the condition they are in. They will review their findings to ascertain what type of nest boxes we require more of and where they are needed to help fulfil the project's overall objective of attracting more wildlife on to our School site. I equally look forward to seeing the Pre Prep Hedgehog houses out in the woodland. Today, the Bat Conservation Trust visited Year 1 and Ms Bilston delivered an interesting talk to the children who then enjoyed bat related activities.

This week our Wellbeing Prefects hosted a break time drop in session in the Green Room for any Prep pupils who wanted to speak to them for support or advice. Stocked up with cookies and squash, they were ready and waiting to help anyone who needed them. Wellbeing Prefects are there to offer peer to peer pastoral support across the School, to consider potential pastoral initiatives, and to be pupil ambassadors of The Town Close Way. They are an important part of the wider Pastoral network and offer another option for our pupils to seek support and friendship across the ages.

Next week we look forward to a Bake Sale on Tuesday for Finnbar's Force organised by the School Council (kind donations of cakes to be delivered to the front office with an ingredients list). We also have a Swimming information Evening on Thursday 27th as well as our first Town Close Association Evening in London - if parents are in London working please do feel free to join us.

MATCH REPORTS

RUGBY

Our 1st and 2nd teams made the short journey to Redmayne on Wednesday afternoon. The 1st team were involved in an end-to-end encounter in the first half with Ben S, Wolf S and Alex O C all running strongly with the ball in hand and scoring well-taken tries. The team found the second half tough going and rather ran out of steam in the closing stages. The final score was 4-9, with Wolf S nominated as POM for his tireless efforts throughout the contest. A depleted 2nd team were on the wrong end of a heavy defeat against Norwich School Under 12A, with Henry M (POM) scoring our only try. Ilex S also impressed with his all-round play and determination.

Two Under 10 squads travelled to Lower Close on Wednesday for another set of fixtures against Norwich Lower School. The Under 10AB mix enjoyed a good win by 3-0, with Simon C nominated as POM for his skilful play. Mr Taylor was impressed with a number of his B team players who tackled strongly and demonstrated excellent handling skills against 'A' team opposition. Mr Coyle's Under 10 BC squad lost by 11-15 in another entertaining contest. Seb W was nominated as POM for his all-round play with Hjalmar HP, Henry P, George E-W and Seb W all scoring well-taken tries.

Our Under 11 A, B and C teams were all in action against Norwich Lower School at Main Field. Our Under 11 A team were not at full strength and lost by 5-8. Willoughby W, Jacob B and Freddie G were all nominated as POM by Mr Greenhall for their determined play in what was a good effort against strong opposition. The Under 11 B team won by 6-2 in a rather scrappy contest. Mr Parker nominated James B as POM for his excellent work rate in attack and defence throughout the game. Mr Lawry's Under 11 C team lost narrowly by 10-11 with Reggie J (POM) once again leading the way with some strong running with the ball in hand.

Despite a slow start in very cold conditions, the U11B team secured a well-deserved 3–1 victory at Beeston. Numerous first-half chances were kept out by an impressive Beeston goalkeeper, and a breakaway goal meant we trailed 1–0 at half time. A focused half-time team talk sparked an excellent second-half performance. The girls moved the ball confidently, created sustained pressure, and finished their chances calmly. Charlotte W levelled the score, reacting quickly to a rebounded shot, before Frances H added two well-taken goals, including one showcasing outstanding individual stick work. The defence remained solid throughout, with Flo L named Player of the Match for her consistency and composure. Frances H also earned Player of the Match for her contribution. A great team effort—well done, girls!

In a pair of competitive fixtures against Beeston, both the U11C and D teams demonstrated impressive effort and teamwork. The D team worked hard to put into practice their lesson focus on passing into space for teammates to run onto. Despite their determination, they came up against a couple of particularly strong Beeston players and were unable to secure a win.
