Dear Parents

A gloriously sunny morning brings us to the final day of a busy week. The Christmas spirit is truly alive at Town Close and many of my highlights from this week have a festive thread to them. We started the week with Reverend Dr. Patrick Richmond leading our Prep Assembly. Reverend Patrick spoke about the season of Advent and the symbolism of the Advent Ring and the candles that are lit each Sunday in the lead up to Christmas, something which he reminded of us of during the Pre Prep Carol Service at Christchurch Eaton yesterday afternoon. There is something truly magical about a carol service and Year 1 and 2 did a tremendous job in delivering festive cheer in abundance with their confident readings and lovely singing – a huge well done and thank you to the congregation for belting out the carols with real enthusiasm. I very much look forward to our Prep Carol Service at St. Peter Mancroft on 17<sup>th</sup> December – the final day of this term.

My absolute highlight of this week was the return of the House Christmas Music competition which challenged our Prep pupils to learn a Christmas song (drawn from a hat with each House allocated an upbeat Christmas classic) in their House groups in just one morning: the tune, the lyrics and the actions! They then performed to one another in the Read Hall accompanied by an incredible Staff band. The result was an extraordinary morning of House teamwork and festive fun that culminated in a fantastic finale of Christmassy joy, expertly opened by Year 2 who performed their rendition of 'Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree'! Well done to all of the children, particularly those in Barton who were voted by our esteemed judges to have delivered the winning performance. Our special thanks go to A-Level Music pupil, Max, from The Wherry School Norwich who joined Mrs Sims to perform the unenviable job of judging the final performances. Also, to the incredible Staff band of Mrs Kozcur, Mr Gibson, and Mr Legg. But the music competition was not the only festive House event this week; A Christmas Quiz House Competition, with a catchy name of 'A Sleigh Ride to Christmas' led by the Year 8 House Captains took place on Thursday. They devised the questions (including a very difficult 'Home Alone' starter); created the presentation; set up the Read Hall; chose the House teams; and hosted the game show-style quiz with great confidence and energy! Well done to Ilex, Amelia, Edward, Daniel, Sophia, Harriet, Annabelle, & Ananti!

Next week we will have a jam-packed schedule of festive events to enjoy with a host of Pre Prep Nativities, Christmas Ensembles, Christmas Celebration on Friday afternoon and Christmas Jumper Day. I would also like to say thank you again to all who have supported the Break Christmas present appeal and to give a last chance call to bring in presents before Break collect them next week.

It hasn't all been festive frivolity this week and it is pleasing to see the pupils working very hard across the curriculum, striving to make the most out of every moment in the run up to a well-deserved break. Other highlights of the week included welcoming parents in for two after school events; with Thomas Frank's joining us on Tuesday to answer questions about the new catering offering at the school, with plenty of yummy samples from the menu for parents to try, and parents joining me yesterday evening for an information evening on the upcoming ski trip to Passo Tonale – a first for Town Close. In the New Year, we will be looking to launch the ski trip for the next academic year with those pupils who have been on the waiting list for the trip this year being offered first refusal on a place. This was the last week of competitive matches and we reflected in assembly about what a successful season it has been across the myriad of teams that have represented the school. There is so much for them to be proud of and I look forward to the end of season reports from Wolf S and Ellie C, our Rugby and Hockey captains, before we find out who will be Boys' Hockey Captain and Girls' Netball Captain for the season ahead. This week our Nursery children experienced their first taste of 'Wobbel Yoga' with Sophie from The Yoga Feed Norwich. Sophie guided them through a range of poses and breathing exercises, testing their balance and their concentration before the lights were turned down and they finished the session with a period of relaxation on the arched boards. I also found out today that our Pre Prep pupils have been awarded the Green Tree School Award from the Woodland Trust for the environmental work that they have carried out this term during their 'Into the Woods' topic – I can't wait to see the well-deserved plaque proudly displayed over in Pre Prep and thank you to Mrs. Smith who coordinated this. Year 1 also celebrated the 'Into the Woods' theme, throwing a cake sale to raise money for the Bat Conservation Trust Norwich Branch. Well done to them for raising £120 to support this charity.

Our Year 8 pupils and a handful from Year 7 have also enjoyed the opportunity to pop over to Norwich School today; the Year 8 for what I am sure will be an exciting Design and Technology workshop and our Year 7 pupils visiting as part of their Latin and Classics Elective. The Year 7's will be presenting what they have learnt in this elective to myself and Mrs. Sims next Friday and I am very grateful to Mr. Griffiths for leading this very popular elective option this term. Next term will bring the next round of electives for our Year 7 pupils with Latin and Classics being taken up by a new set of pupils, along with options around Art History, Ceramics, Musical Theatre and Architecture. This has been such a welcome addition to the Year 7 curriculum and we look forward to building upon the success of this, both over the course of this year and going into the next year when we will have pupils in both Year 7 and Year 8 enjoying this option as part of the PSB.

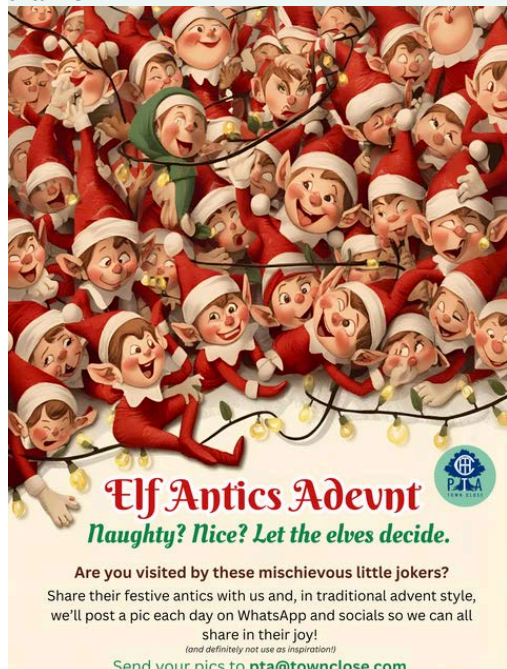

# MATCH REPORTS

The U13Bs saved their best hockey for their final match this season. What a performance from the whole team, with highlights from Isla Mc down the right wing, and Geena S and Pearl T in defence. This was the girl's best performance, giving them a well deserved 9-1 win. Players of the Match were Isla Mc and Geena S.

The U11As experienced their first indoor tournament at Langley. The girls drew their first match but unfortunately lost some of the other matches in the afternoon, coming 6<sup>th</sup> in the Tournament. Our lack of experience in using the walls to gain territory and create attacking positions made the game especially challenging. Despite this, Joanie S was electric both in attack and defence, making a significant impact throughout. Hannah B remained steady and reliable in defence, offering much-needed composure at the back. The girls finished the day saying they would love to play more Indoor Hockey—making it a truly valuable and positive experience. Joanie S was awarded Player of the Match.

The U11Bs ended their season in outstanding fashion with an emphatic 5–0 victory over Norwich School. After an even opening spell, Town Close broke the deadlock through a superb finish from Charlotte W. She quickly doubled the lead with a well-executed shuffle, before Frances H replicated the move to make it 3–0. At the other end, Ophelia B produced a string of excellent saves, including stopping a shuffle herself, ensuring the team maintained full control going into halftime. Confidence remained high as Town Close continued to dominate in the second half. A flowing team move saw Emily R convert another shuffle to extend the lead to 4–0, and Charlotte W completed her hat-trick late in the game to round off a superb performance. Every player contributed brilliantly. Charlotte L and Flo L were exceptional in defence and worked superbly as a pair. Jemima T-N provided her trademark stability and structure in midfield, while the forward trio of Charlotte W, Emily R and Frances H worked together fluidly and effectively throughout. Charlotte W's outstanding all-round display also earned her the opposition's Player of the Match award. It has been a pleasure to coach these girls this season, well done to every one of them. The C, D and E teams also enjoyed a great afternoon of hockey. The Cs winning 7-3, the Ds winning 1-0 and the Es finished with a 0-4 defeat. Well done to everyone and to Ani M, Eva W-H and Matilda H who were all awarded player of the match with the C, D and E teams respectively. 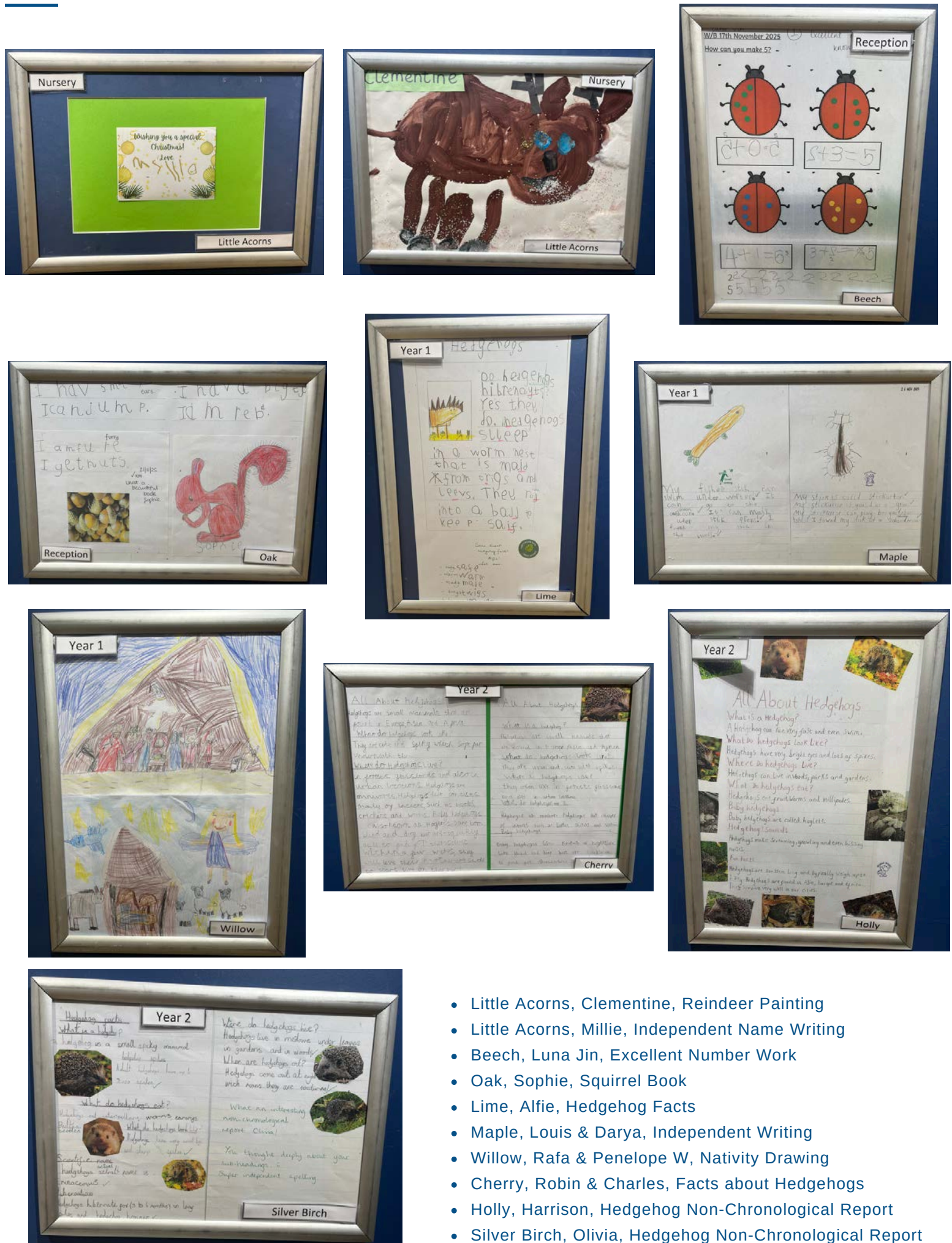
