Dear Parents

I write to you today having just delivered the last assembly of a busy STEM week. Alongside the usual Friday Assembly features of celebrating the achievements and notable successes of our pupils (particularly well done to our U13 netballers for the bronze IAPS medals), I also had the chance to share some of my favourite mathematical curiosities, including Durer's Magic Square hidden in the piece of artwork 'Melencolia I' and Kaprekar's Constant. I was particularly pleased to see an email ping into my inbox as I type this from Mrs. Sim's Year 5 maths set, not only thanking me for my assembly, but also challenging me on whether my use of 0 as a place holder was correct (it was in this instance, but you were right to question it!).

There have been lots of fantastic events as part of our STEM week, including pupils from Nursery to Year 4 going on a magical trip to the moon and beyond as we welcomed in Andy, a fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society, from StarDome Planetarium. They rocketed to the moon before looking down at the Earth and the evolution of life on our planet. An incredibly immersive experience, it was a wow moment for all of our children. On Tuesday, Years 4 - 6 took part in a maths workshop in the Sports Hall, completing a rotation of problemsolving puzzles and challenges. They enjoyed applying their mathematical knowledge to find solutions and supporting each other in the varied tasks. Having spent the weekend baking for their STEM challenge homework, the Year 7 and 8's Bake Sale on Tuesday was a huge success, raising £218.00 for our School charity, Able2B. On Wednesday, we focused on careers in STEM, Our Year 8 pupils were very fortunate to welcome into School Barnabas Shelbourne, Greenpower Education Trust CEO. Barnabas began his career as a youth worker, and he explained how the transferrable skills he acquired helped him in his role at Greenpower, a charity dedicated to inspiring young people around the world to enjoy and participate in science, technology, engineering and maths. Our Year 8 pupils have experienced first-hand the incredible work of the Charity through their participation in F24. Having hands-on, practical access to engineering has enhanced their understanding of the discipline and fuelled their passion for the subject. Barnabas's key takeaway messages were to encourage our pupils to say 'yes' to new experiences, and to learn from everyone and everything around you. I had the pleasure of joining Greenpower and Mr Buck later that day, for the Norfolk Community Foundation 'Illuminate' event at the Norfolk Showground. Year 5 and 6 were treated to an insightful STEM talk from Town Close alumni Fred Anthony. Fred, a Lotus Cars Product Designer, related his journey from Town Close to his role at Lotus, explaining his love of all subjects at school. He joined Lotus after graduating, working on the design of the 'Evija' and the Olympic bike design. The Lotus Emira made a special appearance on the Prep playground to great interest from all of our pupils, helping to inspire the next generation of engineers. On Thursday, Year 5 went on a trip to the Exploring Science Amusement Laboratory in Bowthorpe, a hands on scientific lab allowing children a fully immersive experience. In the afternoon, we were joined by Emily Holloway who gave Year 7 a careers talk about her route into Formula E – another fantastic talk and thank you to Emily for joining us. Alongside all of this it has been so lovely to see so many different experiments on the go this week, with the perennial favourite of 'Elephant's Toothpaste' being a highlight.

My non-STEM related highlight was 3H's class assembly, which was an absolute triumph in providing a blend of entertainment (great rendition of 'Ice, Ice Baby'!), information (I didn't know about the doctor removing his own spleen!) and food for thought (the power of perseverance). It was wonderfully rounded-off with the first performance form the Town Close Trebles – our new choir that involves every single pupil in Years 3 and 4, who sang beautifully. On a choir related note, we were also treated to a lovely performance this morning from the Prep choir ahead of their performance at the Norfolk County Music Festival – well done to all who have already taken part in the County Music Festival this week and good luck to those performing next week.

MATCH REPORT

NETBALL

Last Friday, the U10's enjoyed a fantastic afternoon of netball against Norwich High School. The A team demonstrated brilliant determination and teamwork. The B team had enjoyable matches and, although there were losses, this did not reflect how well the teams played. POM was awarded to Willa C. The C and D team played well together; in the first half, despite solid defensive pressure, they struggled with their transition through the thirds and were unable to convert possession into goals due to some inconsistent shooting. The second half, the girls improved their movement off the ball, creating better attacking channels and executing more accurate feeds into the shooting circle. This allowed for increased scoring opportunities, and they were thrilled to secure a well-deserved win. It was encouraging to see stronger attacking plays and more effective court balance. The U13's travelled to Ipswich last Friday to compete in the Netball IAPS, facing strong opposition throughout the tournament. They started with a close match against Gresham's before taking on two tough opponents, Barnardiston and Felsted, the eventual runners-up. Despite the challenges, the team remained in high spirits and secured a place in the plate competition. Their determination shone through with a brilliant victory over Langley, earning them a spot in the semi-finals against Culford.
